#### Words from Our Pastor- Bob Mitchell

I've been told that when movies are being made, there's always more footage shot than will be seen in the theatres. Sometimes half of what was shot ends up on the cutting room floor. The same reality holds true for good sermons. Not everything in the study makes it into Sunday morning messages.

But some stuff is simply too good to rest permanently on the cutting room floor. So let me share a word-picture that excited my soul, but it didn't quite fit into the flow of last Sunday's sermon, so it's laying at my feet here in the study. Let me use it in this article.

Author Leonard Sweet asks: "Is your clay moist?" That question takes me back to my elementary school years

(and yes, I can still remember that far back) where we were given

clay in art class to allow our imaginations to express themselves. But if you acciden-



tally left your clay out overnight, it became hardened, inflexible: an artless glob. It was an exercise in frustration to put that hardened clay on the potter's wheel.

You had to keep the clay moist to keep it supple, pliable and flexible if creations of beauty were going to result from it. The principle has a clear application in the life of the Spirit. I need to keep the clay of my spirit moist if the Potter is able to fashion me into what He has in mind. I can retain moisture by engaging in the spiritual

disciplines that we so often talk about at Lincoln.

I need to be around others whose spirits are moist.

I need to spent alone-time with God that heaven's dew would fall on me, keeping me refreshed and moldable.

I need to delight in 'the law of the Lord', meditating on Scripture consistently. The Psalmist points out that such delight actually plants you by streams of living water that keep your leaf from withering (mixing metaphors, but you get it).

So as we live in the shadow of an empty Tomb and a Risen Savior, let's keep our spirits moist. Remaining in the hands of The Potter, I am,



**Growth Groups:** It was noted that 80% of the congregation are involved in growth groups: 24 groups, 326 enrolled, 237 distinct members.

conference in South Africa in August, 2016. Sponsored by Foundations Ministries, Inc., this conference seeks to empower women to break the cycle of oppression, abuse and injustice. Marie will be providing leadership in hospitality and prayer.

Worship Report: MSC to provide communion on Good Friday, March 25, 2016 at the 7:00 p.m. worship service.

Youth Report: Session voted to approve Window Washing Fundraiser on Saturday, May 14 for Senior High Youth trip to Mexico.



The Session voted to approve vacation for Pastor Bob Mitchell on April 5 & 6, 2016.

The Session voted to approve a probable vacation for Pastor Bob Mitchell on May 10-17, 2016.

Mission Affinity Group (MAG) with Trinity Presbyterian, Modesto and Escalon Presbyterian will be held at LPC on Saturday, April 16.

A proposed amendment to the ECO Essential Tenets regarding baptism was distributed for review. A vote will be taken at the April 19 Session meeting.

Presbytery Meeting on May 7 will be held at LPC. Our Pastor Bob Mitchell has been named as Chair of the Pastoral Ordination Committee for ECO in this region. This is a two-year commitment.

Expansion Update —The acquisition of 6245 Gettysburg is still unsettled and foreclosure of the property is coming up at the end of April.


