haven't kept it a secret $oldsymbol{ol}}}}}}}}}}$ or that I have been writing a book. The book has taken four years to complete, but I finally finished with the first draft. During that time, it came to my attention that through Denise Miller, I might be able to have a faceto-face with one of the most prolific Christian authors today. His name is Mark Batterson. In a way, I see this experience as a metaphor of the past 12-14 months. Our dreams and plans for expansion at Lincoln got a bit re-routed when Zak, then Jon, then Matt unexpectedly left to take ministry positions in far larger ministry settings.

It made 2017 a difficult and stormy year. We weren't planning on that happening any more than I was planning to write my newsletter

Jon Hathorn - Pastor of Church Ministries: Learning to KNOW GOD Better



Someone once said that if you aim at nothing you will hit it every time.
When I was in Jr. High school

everyone had to take PE, also known as Physical Education Class. Some people hated it, others loved it. I can say without any hesitation, it was one of the two highlights of my day, the other bright spot was lunch. Our PE program was recognized by the State of California as a blue chip standard for other schools to follow. Each class period involved a strict regular routine of calisthenics where the class participated

both in doing each exercise in unison as well as yelling with vigor the number of each repetition. Three days a week these exercises were followed with a run of 600 yards and the other two days it was a 6 minute run. The standards by which the PE teachers held the class members was pretty tough. As a

class, if we weren't performing the calisthenics with precision and in unison, we started over. If we weren't yelling loudly and clear enough, we started over. When it came to running, there was a minimum time standard on the 600 yard run and a minimum distance during the 6 minute run for each student. And the standard measurement of successful completion continued to increase throughout the year. After the exercise and running, we were involved in an activity unit lasting for several weeks: football, basketball, wrestling, gymnastics, tennis, softball, track and field, soccer etc. In addition to this every quarter of the school year, for all four quarters, the teachers measured growth in our fitness. We were tested in sit ups, push ups, pull ups, broad jump, 50 yard dash, 600 yard run, and bar dips. These tests measured strength, endurance, speed, and coordination - which was an attempt at a full assessment of our physical fitness. Truthfully, what I really liked about PE was like a butler who is there to the activity portion. Oh, I was pretty good at sit ups and the 600 yard run, but in the 7th grade my pull ups grade was an "F" because I couldn't do any, as in zero, nadda, not even one. So I worked hard and then I finally was able to do a few in 8th grade and then even more in 9th grade.

The point of the class was clear - fitness was communicated, fitness was expected, fitness inspected, and fitness was re-

warded. The PE coaches had objectives and they worked hard to help us be successful as a class and as individuals. They didn't want us to simply pass time and get a paycheck, they were training us.

At Lincoln we have some important objectives and standards that we regularly communicate. They are shared in the church slogan that our church leadership has adopted "Know God, Find Freedom, Discover Your Purpose, and Make A Difference."

Each month for the next four months, I wanted to highlight one of these. The first part of this -KNOW GOD. Many people know about God, and can even spell His name. Many people think of God as a being too busy to have concern for any one individual especially me. Others think of God as a Sheriff, Policeman or other law enforcement officer who is trying to stop every bit of fun that you and I are trying to have. And yet others treat God wait on each of us with any and every request.

God is personal, and He knows everything about you and I and He still loves us. When we realize that He knows everything about us, we will either become afraid and run from Him or we will be relieved at how committed He is to us and want to Know Him.

Some of the ways we help people Know God is by singing

praises to His name, speaking to Him in prayer, reading the Scriptures, listening to the Word of God on Sundays, and finding a group of people who we can study the Bible with together.

On a personal note, God has always known me, but through the help of a great friend, I was shown the love of God and through my friend someone actually introduced me to God at camp. I have enjoyed my journey with God through prayer, reading the Scriptures, listening to sermons, and cherishing Him through music. Let's spend time with God, and spend enough time with someone that they might see that we know God and he or she might want to know God also.

One of the standards set is in the Bible in several places, "Love the Lord your God with all your heart, all your soul, and all your mind." Lets keep Knowing God as a target. Maybe you are like me and those pull ups that I struggled doing in that you feel like you don't know much of anything about God. That's ok. So if you are looking for a way to start, a daily devotional guide is a perfect bullseye to aim for each morning. Two of my favorite devotional books are entitled "JESUS CALLING" and "STREAMS IN THE DESERT."
