arch 17th was a great day of celebration.

I read a great article recently that is very appropriate for our transition. It is entitled Stay At 17 Inches - by Chris Sperry. It is about a 78 yearold baseball coach named John Scolinos who spoke at a baseball convention while wearing an actual home plate around his neck as he spoke to 4,000 baseball coaches from all over the United States. Using key thoughts from this article about his speech, can help all of us know that we at LPC are in good hands and have some exciting days ahead.

17 inches is the width of a baseball home plate, whether it is for those really young athletes playing T-ball in



little league, those a few years older using a pitching machine, those who have made a little league all star team, those who play travel ball almost year-round, the high school players, college teams or the professionals who are paid to play the game. That's the standard. The pitchers, the batters, the catchers, the umpires all use that standard - it doesn't change. The width of the plate is never widened, not when the pitcher is tired, not when the pitcher is having a bad day, because 17 inches is the standard. And it is to this standard of 17 inches that all players are held accountable. Coach Scolinos' message transitioned into the importance of standards and accountability in our

lives. Our government, our marriages, our homes, our parenting, our schools, and our churches continue to widen the plate and those who should be responsible leaders are unwilling to hold themselves and those they serve to proper standard.

As we "settle in" together and "gear up" together for celebrating Holy Week, special Spring and Summer traditions, and the opening of our new multi-purpose building this Summer – I want to assure you more than anything that the authority of the Word God and the grace of Jesus Christ for our sins are two incredible standards that LPC and all our leadership hold dear. 



At the end of February, we should be at approximately 17% of our income & expenditures. We are at 14%, but caught up in the income category over January. We are \$1,987 in the red at the end of February but have had some one-time expenses in the first 2 months. At the end of February, the Capital Campaign had \$248,693 in the bank. As the building process goes into full-swing, we will need to activate our loan.

The *Financial & Estate Planning Seminar* in February was a success with 43 people attending. Our presenters were outstanding and everyone learned something to help them in their planning.

One new thing that could help some of you is regarding the Required Minimum Distribution (RMD). If you are over 70 ½ and have an IRA, you can do a charitable rollover of your RMD from your IRA to LPC. This would do the following:

- Provide you with a charitable deduction on your taxes
- Reduce the amount of taxable income reported on your taxes
- Reduce your income for Social Security purposes and thereby perhaps reduce your obligation.

This seems like a worthy idea to pursue. If you're interested, contact your investment or tax person on how to do this for 2019.


