The keystone habit that promotes spiritual growth is **meaningful interaction** with God’s Word.

Certain portions of the Bible become personal **favorites**.

- These are places where you ‘**dig a well**’ from which you draw repeatedly

Isaiah 62

- Written for a time when the cause of God **was suffering** greatly
- Prophetically proclaimed that circumstances **can and would** be different
- Speaks into the ‘gap’ between how things currently are and what they can be when God intervenes
- Describes God’s **designs** for His people

'Watchmen' **remind** the Lord.
